

Pluto Aspects in Your Chart

The Energy of Pluto

You have an identity, a way you describe yourself. This may be defined by what you are attached to, such as a relationship partner, a career, or how much money you have in the bank. Aspects of your identity may be tied to your children, your religion, or the sports team you follow. Your sense of identity may come from the beliefs you hold, a personal philosophy, or a script you are following.

During a Pluto transit, aspects of your identity are challenged. Parts of the old you may be destroyed and in its place, your new identity can be born from the ashes.

The purpose of Pluto is to take what is outworn, useless, or dead and remove it from your life. The difficulty arises because you may be clinging to these things, people, or situations because you feel they are necessary to your identity. Your head might understand that it's a good thing to let go of what's no longer useful, but your heart may try to hold on because the old things feel safe, secure, or at least familiar. You may also feel that by letting go, you are admitting that you've been holding onto something that has blocked your growth, kept you small, and caused you to waste past opportunities.

A Pluto transit is a humbling process. Pluto can tear you down, dismantle your identity, and leave it in pieces. But it does this for a purpose: so you can rebuild stronger and better.

Pluto is a slow-moving planet that goes retrograde for long periods, so it can aspect a natal planet over a period of two or three years. During the first exact aspect, you will recognize the need for change. Something may shift in your world, causing you to redefine who you are. Or the change may come from within, where you realize you can no longer be who you've been. When Pluto goes retrograde and makes that exact aspect again, you may feel great frustration at being faced with the same problem you thought you had already dealt with. Then, as Pluto goes direct and hits your planet for a third time, you may come up with a new solution, a better way of doing things. For some people, the next retrograde of Pluto will again cross your natal planet, sending the message that Pluto is not finished with you yet. On the final aspect, you will see more options and realize how much you have changed for the better.

Overall, this is a difficult process that needs to be met with patience, understanding, and self-care. You can't avoid it, but by being kind to yourself and willing to let go, you can make the process much easier.

Pluto in Aquarius



Astrology has been around for a long time. There are quite a few books dating back to the 1500s, with some records going as far back as a thousand years BC. So, there is a lot of material about charts, the signs, the Sun and Moon, and the five visible planets. However, since Pluto was first spotted on February 18, 1930, and it takes Pluto 247.9 years to orbit the Sun, there is not much written about Pluto in Aquarius.

Even though we couldn't see Pluto at the time, we know where it was in the past. The last time Pluto was in Aquarius was from 1777 to early 1798. The American Revolution occurred from 1775 to 1783. The U.S. Constitution was established in 1787, and the Bill of Rights was ratified in 1791. This was a tumultuous period in history.

The French Revolution took place from 1789 to 1799. Due to economic and social inequality, political upheaval led to the overthrow of the monarchy. Both of these periods were difficult in history, but they resulted in significant political reforms and stronger countries.

The sign of Aquarius is about groups and organizations, but also about being unique and different. So, as Pluto transits Aquarius, there may be three basic expressions of this energy related to groups and eccentricities.

The first is that people may gravitate toward groups, looking for their "tribe." This may be expressed in a Yin energy, where a person passively identifies with the group. They may be a member without actively participating, perhaps not even attending meetings. Or, they may be a fan of a sports team but prefer to watch the games at home rather than attend in person. There is also the Yang expression of this energy, where a person seizes upon a group and becomes its leader. They could lead them to something great or something destructive. They may try to hold onto power because Pluto is associated with power and control.

The second expression of Pluto in Aquarius is the person who feels so different, so unique, that they cannot find a group or are not interested in connecting with others. The Yin energy of this expression could be a van lifer living on public lands, only occasionally coming into town for supplies. The Yang expression of this could be the lone gunman, a person who feels so isolated and unconnected that they harm the world around them.

Pluto in Aquarius



The third expression of Pluto in Aquarius is related to its co-ruler, Saturn. Aquarius is ruled by both Uranus and Saturn. Saturn, which also rules Capricorn, is about tradition, respectability, and reserved qualities. In this third expression, people may feel that things are moving too quickly and that it was better in the past. The Yin expression of this energy could be someone who shies away from technology and yearns for something more traditional. The Yang expression of this energy could be a person who takes control and wants to return society to the way it was, reverting to old gender roles or shutting down technology. These people seek power and control.

Pluto in Aquarius is also connected to technology. So, the three expressions could include a person so immersed in technology that they are willing to have it implanted into their body, actually becoming a cyborg. There will also be groups of people who walk away from technology, opting for basic phones and refusing to answer emails. The final group may attempt to stop technological progress through laws and legislation. They might decide that a particular level of technology is acceptable, but anything beyond that is suspicious.

The first date listed is the exact aspect. The week before and the week after this date may be the most intense times. The dates in parentheses indicate the entire duration of the transit. Since Pluto goes retrograde, you may have three to five exact dates for each aspect, with one or two of these occurring during Pluto's retrograde motion. Sensitive and intuitive people may feel this energy earlier and for a longer duration, so use the dates in this list as guidelines.

Transiting Pluto square ascendant

During this transit, you will know that something needs to change. You may have very intense encounters with others that could completely transform important relationships in your life. There may be a period of upheaval in your marriage or other close personal relationships, but this is a necessary disruption. If you face it head-on, you can address and resolve issues within the relationship.

Some relationships in your life may have outlived their purpose and may end altogether. This will create space for new people to come into your life and for better relationships to form. Pluto symbolizes death and resurrection, so old relationships will be replaced by new ones.

A person may enter your life who has a powerful effect on your mind and emotions, almost having a magical hold on you. No matter how hard you try to escape their influence, you may feel held by an invisible hand. They may take advantage of your weakness or fear, using this knowledge to control you. Pluto is teaching you about the part of you that gives away your power, and how to recognize this vulnerability so you can deal with it.

This transit is also about your personal power, your ability to lead, and your ambition to do so. You may have opportunities that, in the past, would have seemed outside your comfort zone but are now well within your abilities. You may rise in your career, gain important social contacts, and expand your world.

Transiting Pluto sextile Sun

During this time, subtle energies are at work, helping you make creative changes in your life. You have an opportunity to act more effectively than you have in the past. You may also have opportunities to take on more power and assume a position of authority. However, this is a subtle influence, and you may not feel compelled to seize these opportunities, which could cause you to miss out. You'll need to make a conscious effort to take hold of what you want.

You have the ability to establish good relationships with authority figures now, including your boss or other officials. You also have an enhanced ability to work well with groups or organizations. At the same time, you may stand out in the group as a person of power and authority.

Overall, this is a time of rebuilding. Changes in your life can occur that will completely alter your objectives. Your goals will become clear, and your consciousness will expand.

Transiting Pluto semi-square North Node

During this time, opportunities may arise that challenge you to push beyond your comfort zone. It's also possible that a cherished goal may no longer be viable in the form you had envisioned. Your vision may need to change, possibly to accommodate new circumstances in the world. However, it's more likely that you have changed, and this old goal no longer serves you.

Transiting Pluto opposed midheaven

This may be a time of great change related to your personal and family life. During this transit, you could gain an understanding of the effects and conditioning of your childhood and early home life. These experiences can help you free yourself from problems in adulthood that stem from your early years. This may also be a time when you declutter your current home, undertake renovations, rebuild, or change residences.

Pluto square Saturn

Over the years, you have created a framework or structure in which your life operates. This may include your job, your relationships, and where you live. These are the boundaries you set up to give your life predictability, a sense of order, and rules you know and understand. During this transit, whether you like it or not, Pluto has come to dismantle it. What you will end up with is a collection of pieces that you can then use to construct a better life structure.

The process itself can feel as though external forces are at work, destroying what you have been building for a long time. However, Pluto is only taking away what needs to change. When Saturn is involved, we tend to resist. You may expend an enormous amount of energy trying to keep things the way they are. You might tell yourself that these things are important because they make you feel safe and secure, but in reality, they are hindering your growth. Additionally, resources that you had access to previously may no longer be available, pushing (or forcing) you to go in a new direction.

But when all is said and done, the results can be extraordinary. You will be able to create a solid foundation on which to build something monumental.



Pluto in the third house

During this transit, you may feel an urge to go beyond a superficial understanding of a subject and seek a much deeper insight. You will come to understand the true meaning of the phrase, "knowledge is power." You will also gain a better understanding of the people in your immediate environment. You will see the hidden motives behind their actions and understand why people do what they do.

This is also a time when you may find ways to deal with unwanted thoughts, the "monkey mind," or hidden emotions and feelings. You may discover the power of meditation and mindfulness now. Your communication style may change, and you might start teaching, writing, or putting your words out through the media. Honesty will be very important, both from yourself and from the people you interact with.

You may have more interactions with siblings, cousins, or neighbors. Pluto can stir up old attitudes or resentments that have been carried for a long time, and secrets may be revealed.

By the end of this transit, you could gain new skills, especially those related to learning itself. You may transition from being the student to the teacher, or even become a published author. You might find peace through meditation, and your relationships with those in your closest community could be strengthened.

Pluto in the fourth house

The fourth house is one of the four angles, and when Pluto crosses an angle, the effect is more intense. The fourth house cusp is also called the IC and brings an opportunity to make a fresh start, even if you didn't think you needed one. This house represents home and family, including childhood conditioning and how your parents affected you. As a result, you may become consciously aware of the deep impression that your childhood had on you. You may begin to interact with your parents in a whole new way. You might discard deeply ingrained patterns of behavior and get to the bottom of long-standing issues that stem from childhood patterns.

During this time, your relationship with one or both parents could change. This could be due to external circumstances, such as moving away or becoming more independent. Roles may switch, and you could find yourself taking care of your parents as they get older.

This transit also involves the home itself. You may purchase a home, embark on extensive renovations, or face external factors that create difficulties in your home, such as a road being built behind it or weather-related damage. You may move away from home, change roommates, or bring a partner into the home. In some cases, you might make a dramatic move, such as relocating to a new country.

Cancer is cardinal water. It is ruled by the moon. It is your nurturing instinct, your homemaking ability, and your connection to family.



Capricorn is cardinal earth. It is ruled by Saturn. It is your desire to build something, to become an authority, your ability to work hard and to achieve something.



Leo is fixed fire. It is ruled by the Sun. It is your creative ability, your self-expression, courage, and showmanship.



Aquarius is fixed air. It is ruled by Uranus and co-ruled by Saturn. It is your eccentricities, your wish to be part of a group, your forward thinking and innovative ideas.



Virgo is mutable earth. It is ruled by Mercury. It is your diligence, your organizing ability, your health and your willingness to serve others.



Pisces is mutable water. It is ruled by Neptune and co-ruled by Jupiter. It is your intuition, your empathy, the secret to keep and where you like to escape to.

The Planets



The Sun represents your identity, your ego, your talents and potential. You're learning how to be your Sun in this lifetime.



Saturn represents your career, your expertise, the people in authority over you, and when you should be reserved, respectful and prudent.



The moon represents your needs, your range of emotions in your deepest feelings. You search your whole life trying to satisfy the needs of your moon.



Uranus represents the surprises that come into your life, your eccentricities, your desire to be innovative and connect through technology.



Mercury represents your mind, your ability to communicate in your thinking process.



Neptune represents your intuitive nature, your secrets and inner life, your dreams, and your fears.

Jupiter represents what you want to expand, your teachers, your knowledge and your connection to a higher power.



The North Node represents your life path and suggests what would make you happy.




The South Node represents where you have come from and what you need to let go of to follow your path.

The Houses of the Chart

The natal chart is a picture of the positions of the planets at the time of your birth. The sky above you and the sky below you (beneath the horizon) are divided into 12 houses, each representing a different area of life.

There are different ways of dividing up the houses. In this report, we are using the Placidus house system, which is currently the most widely used system in the United States. This means that the houses in your chart may vary in size, and as a result, over the 20-year transit of Pluto in Aquarius, Pluto may cross from one house to another in your chart. See the page titled What Pluto Is Doing in Your Chart in 2025 to read about the houses Pluto will be traveling through.

Outside of a transit hitting a planet, a transit hitting one of the four angles of the chart is the most intense. So, a transit crossing into the first house (Ascendant), the fourth house (IC), the seventh house (Descendant), or the tenth house (Midheaven) will bring you the most intense experiences.



The Houses of the Chart

- First house (also called the Ascendant) how others see you, your physical appearance, your vitality and inherent strength, and your outlook on life.
- Second house money, possessions, personal resources, and your sense of self-worth.
- Third house neighbors, siblings, communication, early education, short-distance travel, dexterity, and cleverness.
- Fourth house (also called the IC) home, family, ancestors, personal history, tradition, real estate, and the nurturing parent.
- Fifth house creativity, self-expression, children, playfulness, speculation and risk-taking, dating, and romance.
- Sixth house work, health, daily routines, employees, and pets.
- Seventh house (also called the Descendant) partners, close friendships, business partners, cooperation, and open enemies.
- Eighth house shared resources, investments, taxes, inheritance, intimate connections and sexual partners, power, and control.
- Ninth house higher education, travel, legal matters, personal philosophy, religion, and beliefs.
- Tenth house (also called the Midheaven) career, authority, reputation, your brand, honor, prestige, one of your parents (usually the father), and your boss or supervisor.
- Eleventh house friends, groups, organizations, unions, humanitarian enterprises, technology, and innovation.
- Twelfth house secrets, hidden talents, addictions, escapes, neuroses, prisons and asylums, psychic ability, and mystical secrets.

Now you know how this planet is interacting in your chart. If you're doing easy transits, then leaning in brings you abundance. If you are doing difficult transits, then being mindful and actively working with the energy can bring you great rewards.
